

Author Guidelines

Preparation of Draft Paper (Writing Guide)

Full-length draft papers are requested to be prepared according to the following instructions. Regardless of the source of word-processing tool, electronic file of a paper should be prepared in PDF format finally. All papers submitted must have not been published or not be under consideration for publication elsewhere (except in the form of an abstract or as part of a published lecture, review, or thesis).

Length and Elements of a Paper

A paper should not exceed 10 pages in given format (about 8500 words) including figures and tables. The basic elements of a paper are listed below in the order in which they should appear:

- * Paper title
- * Author names and affiliations
- * Body of paper, including figures and tables
- * Acknowledgments
- * References

Abstract

The abstract should be self-contained and citation-free and should not exceed 150 words.

Key word:

Maximum 5 keywords and/or phrases are to be specified in alphabetic order to show the main points of the paper.

Text body

The text body of a paper should be organized into logical parts or sections. The purpose of the paper should be stated at the beginning so that the reader will have a clear concept of the paper's objective. This should be followed by a description of the problem, the means of solution, and any other information necessary to properly qualify the results presented and the conclusions.

Equations

Equations should be set apart from the body of the text and centered. Use one line space to separate equations from text. All equations should be numbered consecutively, using Arabic numerals enclosed in parentheses and positioned flush right along the final baseline of the equation.

Figures

Each figure should be embedded in the electronic manuscript file. All figures should be cited in the paper in a consecutive order. Each figure should be resized into the column's width of or the full text width for consistency and clarity. Letters in a figure should be of minimum 9pt.

Tables

Tables should be cited consecutively in the text. Every table must have a descriptive title and if numerical measurements are given, the units should be included in the column heading. Vertical rules should not be used.

Acknowledgments

All acknowledgments (if any) should be included at the very end of the paper before the references and may include supporting grants, presentations, and so forth.

References

Authors are responsible for ensuring that the information in each reference is complete and accurate. All references must be numbered consecutively and citations of references in text should be identified using numbers in brackets in superscript (e.g., as discussed by Smith ⁽⁹⁾, as discussed elsewhere ^(9, 10)). All references should be cited within the text.

Units

Units of measurement should be presented simply and concisely using System International (SI) units.
